#### Cancellation

#### Visa and Insurance

Participants should check whether or not a visa is required. In most cases a valid passport will be sufficient. A letter of invitation can be provided upon request. Do not forget to make your own travel and health insurance.

#### Travel to Skalský dvůr

Vienna and Prague are the nearest international airports with many trans-Atlantic or trans-continental flights. Prague has a direct express train-service to Žďár nad Sázavou, the railway station closest to Skalský dvůr. A shuttle bus will be arranged from this station. For travel from Vienna, use express train to Brno and change train to Žďár nad Sázavou (all details concerning detailed maps for drivers, shuttle bus and train time-tables are provided on the LERM web site).

# Weather

Weather in the end of June is commonly mild, rather dry and sunny but with potential rain; even heavy rain is possible. Highs of 25 °C are common,  $\sim 30$  °C possible.
