Assessing the economic and health impact of COVID-19 across Europe

Short Description: The COVID-19 pandemic and the measures developed to contain the spread of the virus had an impact on people's economic activity and healthcare utilization. In this talk, we will present the results of a recently published study examining job loss and changes in healthcare utilization due to COVID-19 among older adults in Europe. We will discuss individual and country characteristics associated with job loss and postponed medical appointments as well as methodological aspects of studying effects on multiple levels of influence.
